2022 was a year that started full of promise! The COVID restrictions were ending in earnest and by March 12 the mask mandates in the State of Washington were lifted. It has been a year of transition, but, true to His Word, this was also a year of recovering the priority of building relationships of love; the Lord called us this year to, Build Me A House of Love.

It has been a year of re-emerging as the church that meets publicly and house to house. As the year progressed we grew in Sunday morning participation and our greeting times have become more engaging and long! We are rediscovering the sheer joy of being together in the Lord! He has granted us grace in the past season of testing and by November I sensed that we were entering a new season.

Due to the amazing worship through giving by our Northlake family, we received over \$735,000 in tithes and offerings with nearly \$300,000 of that given to kingdom causes outside of Northlake—an astounding **40%** of giving to missions and ministries outside of Northlake! What a generous congregation of the Lord's people! See the list on page 9 and let it move you to worship and praise of our Lord Jesus Christ! We have been generous on every occasion!

Having exceeded our general fund goal, we were also able to complete major campus projects of repaving our parking lot and reroofing our administration building. And we still ended the year with a cash position of over \$46,000. In addition to this our emergency needs fund was profoundly funded and we have been able to help so many people in these times of historic levels of inflation and need.

A great joy of the year was commissioning our youth pastor, Joshua Wenzek and his wife Alicia and their son Genesis to go and serve the Lord for the sake of the gospel in the Middle East. We also commissioned eight others to serve in Israel/Palestine and to Saudi Arabia, Pakistan and other Middle East destinations as we entered the new year.

I was blessed by two opportunities to speak at major missions conferences in Houston and Washington DC, grateful for the privilege to be a part of the Lord's end time harvest. We also hosted the Vision Camp for our region in October and continue to see many hearts awakened to the call of the Lord to go and work His harvest fields.

Life Groups met in the Winter/Spring season and then again in the Fall to grow in our theme, *House of Love*. Connect Groups as a function of Bible Study Fellowship; the IF Gathering, followed by the monthly IF Table; Men's Group; Vision School, and Foundations. Our Youth Ministry and Children's Ministry along with the Fellowship Team, Worship Team and Finance Team also provide places to connect and grow and serve the Body of Christ.

First Watch continued on the first Sunday evening of each month beginning with a half night of prayer at the of January after a week delay due to inclement weather. We engaged in a fresh way with a format that will hopefully provide families with young children to participate as well, beginning at 5:15pm and ending by 7:15pm with a time of communion and transition halfway to allow for a window to get the kids home to bed as needed. Thank you to Meredith Walthall for leading worship and to the childcare team: Lise Taylor, Bitna Yi and Jenny Tennant.

Our extended ministries celebrated wonderful advances in their mission. Campus Towers secured financing for the Cottages and we hope to break ground in April of 2023. Three Rivers Christian School saw a major door of opportunity open to secure a permanent home for the high school with the closing of the purchase of the Beacon Hill Elementary School campus—10 acres with 24 classrooms and tremendous growth possibilities—on September 16. We hope and pray for school choice to become a reality in the State of Washington. TRCS also celebrated the return of the annual banquet at the Cowlitz County Event Center on November 17. As we entered the New Year, the school board released the funds for the remodeling of the commons area in anticipation of a Fall opening on the Beacon Hill campus.

Marty Shoub joined us in the Easter season to share in a message series about Jesus as the servant of the Lord in Isaiah 49—the Redeemer of Israel and a light to the nations. The elders brought a powerful series of messages in the spring which was such a blessing that we repeated it in the Fall. Thank you to Jack Troupe, Elaine Filkowski, Chris Ferguson, Joe Gerick and Marchelle Knapp for delivering such powerful messages.

I turned 60 in April of 2022, a year that was then marked by *The Send* in Kansas City; speaking for the Juneteenth celebration in Longview; serving on the leadership team for the 34<sup>th</sup> annual Kelso-Longview Leadership Prayer Summit; leading prayer at the revival of the National Day of Prayer Breakfast on May 5; leading a team of 4 from

Northlake to join 36 others in Israel and Palestine to preach the gospel; and, attending the wedding celebration of Ephraim and Joyce Tumusiime in Uganda on August 20.

We are blessed by our amazing worship team community again this year: Joshua Wenzek has been such a great partner to carry the responsibility with me as we continued in a short-staffed configuration this year. And thank you to Alyssa Root and Erika Zeff who also shared the ministry of leading worship on several occasions. The flags were also brought back out to encourage the participation of our kids and all those young at heart.

I also want to say thank you to Anthony Reto, Chris Ferguson, Emily Morgan, Erika Zeff, Jana Schmutz, Meredith Walthall, Meredith Bundy, Jesse Gaub, Lucas Wheeler, Jeremy Karns, Jim Crider, Jenny Stockfleth, Keith Karns, Christian and Christie Schmutz, Jana Knapp, David Hammond, Alyssa Root, and Alicia Wenzek for serving on our worship teams this year on Sunday mornings

I also want to say another God-sized **THANK YOU** to Gary and Jo Rotz who have been so faithful in serving at the sound board and the media station on almost every Sunday again this year—both services. You two are such a blessing!! And thank you to subs Chris Ferguson and Carol Karns who stepped in as needed. Keith Karns has spent this last year serving at Longview Community Church in their time of worship leadership transition also helped in support at Northlake. Thank you, Keith!

Our streaming technology has continued to develop this year. A huge thank you to Jack Troupe who has taken primary responsibility for oversight of this ministry and to Aaron Mills, Gary Rotz, Brad Fisher and Rick Hopkins for assisting when needed. We had to continue working on challenges with streaming, but we are growing in our ability to offer reliable streaming service to those who want to participate when they are away from home or not able to attend due to sickness. Thank you to everyone who made use of the YouTube streaming! What a blessing to stay connected in this way!!

In addition to serving as our Pastor for Children's Ministries, Lise Taylor has provided outstanding communications support by posting our Northlake Weekly e-bulletin, the monthly newsletter, and sending out other timely announcements via email and posting important information on our website. Lise also updates the electonic church directory and keeps us up to date as the congregations shares information to be posted. Thank you as well to Rick Hopkins who has maintained our church

app which is a wonderful tool to access Northlake info in an easy and portable way. He also keeps our online giving in operation, addressing occasional issues that arise with this technology that many are utilizing these days.

After a long delay, we publicly licensed Lise Taylor and Joshua Wenzek for the Gospel Ministry of Jesus Christ. The elders originally voted to license these key pastoral staff members in 2020 but COVID delayed the actual commissioning. We also licensed three ministry partners with Tree of Lie Ministries in Israel, focused on evangelism and pro-life ministry in Israel: Ariel and Shayla Hyde and Avi Hyde, the sons and a daughter-in-law of our long-term partners Richard and Carolyn Hyde of Heart of G-d Ministries. What a joy and privilege to stand with them in this way. And they have opened their hearts and doors to us to partner with them in ministry in Israel in the future!

I also want to say thank you to Jeanne Nortness for faithfully accompanying worship on the piano during our Early Worship Service. Jeanne is one of those faithful, steady servants who provides solid worship support in our traditional style service.

We also continue to be blessed in our Buildings and Grounds Supervisor staffing with Josh Sonnabend providing great skill in all he undertakes keeping our busy, well-used campus in good repair. Marivic Sagun joined our custodial staff this year and is proving to be a conscientious custodian who is very thorough in her work. Jenny Tennant continues to help as our sexton on Sundays assisting in cleaning and trash removal, so our facility is ready for the Longview Korean Church on Sunday afternoons and the TRCS Early Learning Center has rooms that are ready for Monday morning opening at 6:30am.

While we were away Alyssa Root was the interim youth pastor and did a smashing job! She connected so well with the kids and when I got back the transition was flawless! Now she has transitioned to full time ministry with Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA).

The time while I was away and the rest of the year was also super successful because of our amazing volunteer team. We have a united, committed team that serves week after week. I would like to recognize them for their dedicated love towards the students. In addition to Alyssa we have Jack and Kathy Troupe, Kevin Filkowski, Lane Claunch, Pastor Mark Schmutz, Rebecca Hasty, Lise Taylor, Terri Hopkins, Sandra Ray, and Alicia Wenzek. We also have a generous team that brings dinner each week to youth group. The team includes Pastor Mark, Jack and Kathy, Kevin, Lane, Sandra, Anne Stevens and Nova Velasquez, Ed Laulainen, Steve and Jeanne Nortness, Steve Wilcox, Bill Hall, Lise, and Aileen Stanford and Kathleen Rawlings. In addition to all that these brothers and sisters do, I know countless prayers were offered over our young people by them and many of you. Thank God for the gift of prayer and how it changes lives for eternity! Please keep praying!

As the youth pastor I also had some opportunities to preach and lead worship on Sundays. I have really enjoyed preaching to the whole Northlake body. It is a joy to dig into God's word and share what he imparts to me. May his word be planted in all our hearts. May His Kingdom come and His will be done in Longview as it is in heaven! May His praise rise from our body and be a sweet fragrance before his throne!

Through the ministry of ICPI in our city we saw 27 Vision School graduates and 18 go out to the nations on Field Operation (FO) from one end of the 10/40 window to the other. Overall, we've had about 130 VS graduates, and many go out to the nations on 2-week to 1-year trips over the past 5 years. We are still praying and proclaiming that many, many more will go from Longview to all nations; even 1000!

At the end of 2022 we decided to transition to a two night format for youth group; Wednesday Nights for the high school students and Sunday afternoons for the middle schoolers (11 years old to 8th grade). I believe that the Lord wants to grow these young people in their peer groups; to do middle school things with the middle schoolers and high school things with the high schoolers.

I really felt like God gave me the word: "Cast your net on the other side of the boat". I looked up Luke 5 and John 21. In Luke 5, Jesus said to Peter, "Go out into *deeper water* for a catch." I believe this word is for the high schoolers and in John 21 Jesus said, "Cast your net on the *right side* of the boat and you will catch some." I believe that this word is for the middle schoolers. This new format is from the Lord, and it is time to "go into deeper water" and "cast on the right side of the boat". Already we are seeing fruit from this format. It is an exciting season for Northlake Youth! We know that as we walk by faith God has awesome things in store for Northlake Youth!

### Northlake Missions/Ministries Report 2022

#### **VISION SCHOOL**

Vision School was back in full engagement which we hosted at Northlake in the Spring—there are now about 130 local graduates who are prepared to go. We joyfully sent a team of four to Israel/Palestine in August who joined 36 others from across the united States, Canada, Europe and New Zealand. Vision Camp was hosted at Northlake again this Fall. Pastor Mark was also invited to be a plenary speaker at the Staff Conference in Houston in February and at the national missions conference—Mission Camp—in Washington D.C. in July. On Christmas Day we commissioned four more to go to the 1040 window in the New Year. We are praying for more open doors in 2023 and plan to send a Mission Impact Team to Israel/Palestine in the summer. Plan to attend Vision School and go to the nations! The doors are wide open to anyone who wants to go!

#### **UGANDA**

Following the extremely sad news last year that our dear sister Jova Tumusiime succumbed to COVID-19 and went to be with the Lord, we rejoiced to attend the wedding celebration of Ephraim and Joyce Tumusiime on August 20, 2022. Mark Schmutz, Sue Megenity with Brian and Melissa Strom were able to attend in person and participate in this wonderful celebration as well as share in ministry at the DOVE Namagoona Church in Kampala on Sunday. Brian taught the Sunday School class and Mark was privileged to speak at the worship celebration.

Mark Schmutz and Sue Megenity were joined by Amy Brudi as they continue to serve on the DOVE Uganda Children's Fund board which is comprised of members from three US times zones, New Zealand and with our president, Ephraim Tumusiime from Uganda! The ministry stewarded just over \$152,000 to help the poor of Uganda and ended the year with 299 sponsored children. Northlake Church received gifts and pledges to sponsor the teachers in the Rhino Refugee Camp totaling over \$5,800.

#### **MEXICO**

Though our mission was cancelled, we are hoping a team from Northlake might be able to go and serve alongside our brothers and sisters at the Primera Iglesia Bautista Sinai in Tecate during the summer of 2023.

#### **PHILIPPINES**

We were unable again this year to send a team to the Philippines. The joyful news is that our brothers and sisters at Koronadal Evangelical Church in Mindanao have been diligently working to complete their worship facility and reported it has been completed this year! We pray for a team to be able to visit in 2023.

#### **FAMILY PROMISE**

We want to thank Kathy Troupe as our volunteer coordinator who faithfully coordinated Northlake involvement in this community-wide ministry to families in situational homelessness. Due to COVID-19, the ministry was based in the day center in Kelso, which continued throughout 2022.
